Dear Dr. Recht:

On August 23, 2013, we received a complaint alleging Albany County School District #1 discriminated on the basis of disability (XXXXX) against the Complainant's XXXXX (the Student) and retaliated. Specifically, the Complainant alleged that the District: (1) failed to provide the Student a free appropriate public education (FAPE) by failing to consistently implement XXXXX Section 504 Plan requirements to XXXXX; and (2) retaliated against the Complainant for her advocacy on the Student's behalf by XXXXX.

We began investigating the complaint pursuant to Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and its implementing regulation at 34 C.F.R. Part 104, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of disability in programs and activities that receive Federal financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Education (the Department), and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 and its implementing regulation at 28 C.F.R. Part 35, which prohibit discrimination on the basis of disability by public entities. As a recipient of Federal financial assistance from the Department and a public entity, the District is subject to these laws and regulations.

During the course of processing this complaint, the District indicated its desire to voluntarily enter into an agreement to resolve the allegations and compliance concerns raised pursuant to Section 302 of the *Case Processing Manual*. We reviewed this request and determined that it justified entering into an agreement without completing a full investigation.

On April 11, 2014, we received the signed Resolution Agreement, which is enclosed. When the Agreement is fully implemented, the allegations and compliance concerns will be resolved consistent with the requirements of Section 504, Title II, and their implementing regulations. OCR will monitor implementation of the Agreement through periodic reports demonstrating the terms of the Agreement have been fulfilled. We will provide written notice of any deficiencies regarding the implementation of the terms of the Agreement and will promptly require actions to address such deficiencies. If the District fails to implement the Agreement, we will take appropriate action, as described in the Agreement. We will provide the Complainant a copy of each piece of formal correspondence we issue to the District during the monitoring.

We thank the District for voluntarily entering into an Agreement to resolve the issues raised in this complaint. This concludes OCR's investigation of the complaint and should not be interpreted to address the District's compliance with any other regulatory provision or to address any issues other than those addressed in this letter. The case is now in the monitoring phase. The monitoring phase of the case will be completed when OCR determines that the District has fulfilled all of the terms of the Agreement. When the monitoring phase of the case is complete, OCR will close Case Number 08-13-1285 and will send a letter to the District stating that the case is closed.

Please be advised that the District may not harass, coerce, intimidate, or discriminate against any individual because he or she has filed a complaint or participated in the complaint resolution process. If this happens, the individual may file another complaint alleging such treatment.

Please also note the Complainant has the right to file a private suit in Federal court whether or not OCR finds a violation.

Under the Freedom of Information Act, it may be necessary to release this document and related correspondence and records upon request. In the event that OCR receives such a request, we will seek to protect, to the extent provided by law, personally identifiable information, which, if released, could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
