Dear Superintendent Aune:

This is to inform you that the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) is discontinuing its investigation of the referenced complaint against Snoqualmie Valley School District No. 410. In the complaint, it is alleged that, during the 2012-2013 school year, the district discriminated against a student, on the basis of disability, by failing to implement her Section 504 plan when it did not provide:

- 1. advance organizers;
- 2. spell check capabilities;
- 3. a daily assignment organizer for recording assignments;
- 4. computers or computer software;
- 5. extensive feedback and positive reinforcement;
- 6. daily checking of assignment book for accuracy;
- 7. seating near the teacher;
- 8. seating away from added sensory input;
- 9. more time to take tests; and
- 10. flexible homework criteria if overwhelmed.

OCR accepted this complaint for resolution under the authority of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and their implementing regulations. The district has agreed to take the actions set forth in the enclosed voluntary resolution agreement which, when fully implemented, will resolve the issues raised by the complaint. OCR will monitor the implementation of the agreement and will close the complaint when OCR determines that the terms of the agreement have been satisfied. The first report under the agreement is due by January 31, 2014.
