This is to inform you that the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR) is discontinuing its investigation of the above-referenced discrimination complaint against the Eastmont School District No. 206 (district). The complaint alleged that a student was discriminated against, on the basis of disability, when she was unable to earn full points in XXXX XXXXX at XXXX XXX School during spring 2013, if she used the accommodations under her Section 504 plan.

OCR accepted this complaint for resolution under the authority of section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, and their implementing regulations.

The district has agreed to take the actions set forth in the enclosed Voluntary Resolution Agreement (agreement), which, when fully implemented, will resolve the issue raised by the complaint.

OCR will monitor the implementation of the agreement and will close the complaint when OCR determines that the terms of the agreement have been satisfied. The first report under the agreement is due by June 1, 2014.
