Resolution Agreement Colonel Crawford Local School District OCR Complaint Docket # 15-15-1133

The Colonel Crawford Local School District (the District) submits to the U.S. Department of Education, Office for Civil Rights (OCR), this Resolution Agreement to resolve the above-referenced complaint investigation and to ensure compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. § 794, and its implementing regulation, 34 C.F.R. Part 104, and with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, 42 U.S.C. § 12131 *et seq.*, and its implementing regulation at 28 C.F.R. Part 35.

Action Steps

I. The District agrees to make the modifications to Colonel Crawford High School Stadium and its supporting facilities listed in the attached Appendix by no later than beginning of the xxxxx football season. The District will make the modifications required by this Agreement in accordance with the 2010 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Standards for Accessible Design.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: By xxxxx, the District will submit a report to OCR verifying the completion of the items listed in the Appendix and its compliance with the 2010 ADA Standards, including photographs, plans, work orders, invoices, and any other relevant documentation.

II. The District will include information regarding the location of accessible parking for games and accessible seating locations in the stadium in any publications it produces to promote the athletic teams that use the stadium, and it will add information regarding the location of accessible parking and seating locations to the athletic department website, and in any article it posts in the local newspaper. In addition, conspicuous signage about available accessible seating for both sides of the stadium must be posted at the stadium.

REPORTING REQUIREMENT: By xxxxx, the District will submit verification to OCR that the information listed above was included in any publications by the District, to any news media outlet reporting on the District's athletic programs, and on its website.

General Requirements

The District understands that, by signing this Agreement, it agrees to provide data and other information in a timely manner. Further the District understands that during the monitoring of this Agreement OCR may visit the District, interview staff and students, and request such additional reports or data as are necessary for OCR to determine whether the District has fulfilled the terms of this Agreement and is in compliance with the regulations implementing Section 504 at 34 C.F.R. §§ 104.21-104.23 and Title II at 28 C.F.R. §§ 35.149-35.151, which were at issue in this complaint.

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The District understands that OCR will not close the monitoring of this agreement until such time that OCR determines that the District has fulfilled the terms of this agreement and is in compliance with Section 504 and its implementing regulation at 34 C.F.R. §§ 104.21-104.23 and Title II and its implementing regulation at 28 C.F.R. §§ 35.149-35.151.

The District understands and acknowledges that OCR may initiate administrative enforcement or judicial proceedings to enforce the specific terms and obligations of this agreement. Before initiating administrative enforcement (34 C.F.R. §§ 100.9, 100.10), or judicial proceedings to enforce this agreement, OCR shall give the District written notice of the alleged breach and a minimum of sixty (60) calendar days to cure the alleged breach.

When the stadium is in use for games and other public events,	208
the District will provide the appropriate number of accessible	209
parking spaces, including appropriate number of van	302
accessible spaces, at the stadium facility. The spaces shall be	502
located in the area nearest to the accessible route to the	503
stadium entrance. The spaces will be conspicuously marked	703
with signs that conform to the 2010 ADA Standards when in	
use as accessible parking, including identification of van	
spaces. The slopes and cross slopes of the spaces must not	
exceed the maximum permissible pursuant to the 2010 ADA	
Standards.	
The District will provide marked crossings from the existing	502.3
six designated accessible parking spaces to the ticket booth to	
ensure safe passage. Further the District will provide marking	
in the existing aisles that are not access aisles, to avoid	
confusion.	
When the stadium is in use for games and other public events,	216
the District will conspicuously post signs informing the public	703
that accessible parking is available and where it is located.	
The District will make modifications to the surface and	206
leveling of its route from the home side of the stadium to the	302
visitor side of the stadium to ensure that it is stable, firm, slip	303
resistant, and flat, including the threshold into the ticket booth	403
area.	
The District will install seating to the home side seating area	221
that is designed to provide the appropriate number of	802
wheelchair and companion seats based on the total number of	405
seats provided, and ensure that the accessible spaces provide	505
spectators with choices of seating locations and viewing	
angles that are substantially equivalent to the choices of	
seating locations and viewing angles available to all other	
spectators. The wheelchair and companion seating areas will	
be readily accessible to and usable by persons with disabilities	
in an integrated manner. The District will provide an	
accessible route to the accessible home side seating spaces.	
The District will ensure that the ramp leading up to the visitor	405
side bleacher seating meets the requirements of the 2010 ADA	505
Standards, including handrail requirements and slope	
requirements, and that the depth of the accessible seating on	
the visitor side meets the 2010 ADA Standards.
