No correction data were provided.</p>	<p>Guam provided data regarding areas of noncompliance it has identified, but Guam did not provide data regarding the correction of noncompliance.</p>	<p>Guam's final progress report demonstrating compliance with this requirement, which was due December 4, 2006, may be submitted with Guam's FFY 2005 APR, due by February 1, 2007. Guam must provide, in response to Indicator 9 in the APR due February 1, 2007, documentation that it is effective in correcting all noncompliance within one year from identification. Failure to demonstrate compliance (with correction of State identified noncompliance) at that time may affect OSEP's determination of Guam's status under section 616(d) of the IDEA.</p>
