- Task Definition
Define problem. Identify information needed.
- Information Seeking Strategies
Determine all possible sources.
- Location and Access
Locate Sources and information.

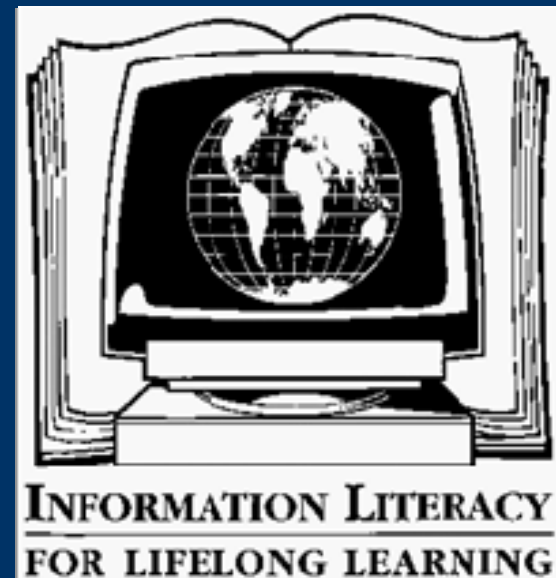
