

Project Abstract

Boise State University College Assistance Migrant Program (BSU CAMP) seeks funds from the U.S. Department of Education to implement a CAMP project in Boise, Idaho. The applicant is fully aware of the rules and regulations regarding CAMP as published in the National Register. This proposal conforms to those rules and regulations. Boise State University has 40 years of experience managing a successful CAMP with its most recent award for the 2019-2024 funding cycle, and as such meets the **Competitive Preference Priority: Consideration of Prior Experience**.

The proposal identifies general goals each with specific objectives, activities, and outcomes, ensuring a detailed and efficient plan of operation. The proposal's objectives are: 1) recruit and enroll 25 eligible participants annually, 2) Provide academic support and advising services that will enable 86% of participants to successfully complete their first academic year in good academic standing (**OME Performance Measure 1**), 3) provide 100% of the participants with supportive services, which includes academic advising, peer mentor support, tutoring, and CAMP class, 4) provide financial assistance to 100% of participants, 5) provide supportive and transitional services so that 92% of participants continue their post-secondary education (**OME Performance Measure 2**), 6) provide monitoring and supportive services to 100% of former CAMP participants until graduation.

BSU CAMP will serve 25 participants annually at Boise State University, Boise, Idaho, offering both commuter and residential opportunities for participants. CAMP will recruit and applicants based on federal rules and regulations and is committed to assisting MSFW and their dependents so that they may complete their initial year in the University and graduate with a university degree. The recruitment, instruction and support services proposed in this application will be in English and Spanish. Annual costs do not exceed \$475,000 for any single budget year. Identified goals and objectives address the federal Performance Measure targets.
