

Abstract: Kansas State University (K-State) Manhattan, KS, serving as the lead fiscal agency partnering with Garden City Community College (GCCC), Garden City, KS, and Colorado State University Pueblo (CSUP), Pueblo, CO, proposes to implement **KANCO4**. KANCO4 will serve students on each of the three partner institution campuses and will: 1) address the educational and support related-needs of college ready migrant students through the bi-state efforts of Kansas and Colorado; 2) apply highly successful undergraduate programming with commuter and residential options; and, 3) partner with the bi-state Migrant Education Programs and other community agencies. **KANCO4** will establish **Four** objectives: 1. 40 eligible MSFW students served each project year; 2.1. 86% of first year students will successfully complete 24 credit hours (PM 1); 2.2 92% of CAMP students who complete their first academic year of college will continue in postsecondary education (PM 2); 3. Follow-up services will be provided to eligible CAMP alumni. The objectives will lead to the following **Five** measurable outcomes: Number of eligible migrant students enrolled each program year, Number of students completing 24 credit hours who have a GPA showing Satisfactory Academic Progress, Number of CAMP first-year completers who returned to enroll in postsecondary education after their first year, Number of CAMP alumni enrolled in postsecondary education, and Number of CAMP alumni having completed a degree. KANCO4's objectives are designed to meet students' social, emotional, and academic needs (**Invitational Priority**). Through the expiration of KANCO3, **KANCO4** meets the **Competitive Preference Priority - Consideration of Prior Experience**.
