

ABSTRACT

Name of Applicant: Oregon State University

The goals and expected outcomes of the project are to help students from migratory and seasonal farm worker (MSFW) backgrounds to 1) enroll and complete their first year in college and, 2) continue their post-secondary degree. The project outcomes are that 86% (Performance Measure 1) of enrolled students will complete their 1st year in good academic standing by attending required academic and support services throughout the academic year and 92% (Performance Measure 2) will enroll for the subsequent academic year and they will be transitioned and encouraged to participate in the academic and support services available at Oregon State University.

The primary activities accomplished by the project will be reaching and recruiting students via school visits, Migrant Education Program (MEP) referrals, attending community events, and networking with community organizations. Recruited students enrolled in CAMP will receive supportive and instructional services that will include academic advising, tutoring, a summer orientation program, a college orientation class, and peer mentoring. Other services will include support during the application process, assistance in obtaining financial aid, and follow-up services for second-year students.

The number and location of the proposed project: The project will serve 35 participants from MSFW backgrounds on the main campus at Oregon State University in Corvallis.

How the competitive and invitational preference priorities are being addressed: The proposed CAMP project meets the Competitive Preference Priority because the OSU CAMP project was funded during the previous grant cycle in 2019-2024. The project will also address the Invitational Preference Priority - Meeting Student Social, Emotional, and Academic Needs, which is described fully in the proposal narrative - Project Design section.
