

**Location:** Wenatchee Valley College (WVC), located in North Central Washington State, is a proud Hispanic Serving Institute (HSI) with nearly 15 years of experience in successfully operating the WVC College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP). As a public two-year community college, WVC provides academic, professional/technical, adult basic education, and community education. Approximately 35% of the 100,000 MSFW workers in Washington work in the three counties served by WVC. WVC proposes a College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) based out of the main campus in Wenatchee, WA while also allowing students enrolled at its northern campus in Omak, WA, to be eligible to participate if they meet all program requirements. WVC CAMP will admit 45 students annually who are migratory and seasonal farmworkers (MSFWs) (and/or children of MSFWs).

**Goals and Expected Outcomes:** In accordance with the Government Performance Results Act (GPRA), the project goals are clearly defined to ensure program outcomes. **Goal 1:** to ensure 86% of participants complete their first year of college (GRPA #1). **Goal 2:** 92% of students who complete their first academic year of college will continue their postsecondary education (GRPA #2). **Activities:** The project is specifically designed to address the gaps of the target population: (1) history of low-income; (2) educational challenges; (3) lack of role models; A broad range of services and culturally relevant activities, focused on addressing these gaps and embedded in the principles of building a culture of success, have been developed in collaboration with WVC, K-12 education, and community organizations. Activities include outreach, recruitment, selection, and support services related to academics, finances, career, and social-emotional health. Services and activities include financial support, tutoring, mentoring, academic advising, parent events, leadership development opportunities, etc. **Applicable Priorities:** WVC CAMP will address Competitive Preference Priority 1 for prior experience.
