

Abstract: Drury University (Drury) Monett, MO, serving as the lead fiscal agency proposes to implement **Drury CAMP**. This CAMP project will: 1) address the educational and support related-needs of college ready migrant students through the bi-state efforts of Missouri and Arkansas; 2) apply highly successful undergraduate programming for commuter students; and, 3) partner with the bi-state Migrant Education Programs of Missouri and Arkansas and other community agencies. **Drury CAMP** will establish **Four** goals with **Five** objectives: **Goal 1.** Increase awareness of postsecondary educational opportunities amongst migrant and seasonal farmworker students and their families (Objective **1.0** 25 eligible MSFW students will be served each project year); **Goal 2.** CAMP students will receive support to maximize their college experience and achieve academic success (Objective **2.1** 86% of first year CAMP students will successfully complete 24 credit hours, GPR 1, Objective **2.2** 92% of CAMP students who complete their first academic year of college will continue in postsecondary education, GPR 2); **Goal 3.** Promote student achievement in Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM), or Computer Science (Objective **3.0** All students will receive the opportunity to complete STEM and/or Computer Science based internships, Competitive Preference Priority 1); **Goal 4.** Monitor progress of CAMP alumni and provide follow-up services (Objective **4.0** Follow-up services will be provided to eligible CAMP alumni). Outcomes include 22 of 25 (GPR 1) students annually completing the first year of postsecondary education successfully, and 21 of 22 (GPR 2) students returning for their second year of postsecondary education annually. Through the expiration of the current ABAC HEP grant, **ABAC HEP** meets Competitive Preference Priority 2 – Consideration of Prior Experience.
