

## **Abstract**

Fort Scott Community College (**FSCC**), Fort Scott, Kansas, in partnership with the State Departments of Education of Kansas, Arkansas, and Oklahoma; agribusiness partners; three state Parent Advisory Councils (**PAC**) and with the support of Tri-State CAMP and numerous other state and local agencies, is seeking funding through the High School Equivalency Program (**HEP**) funded by U.S. Department of Education, Office of Migrant Education (**OME**).

Using the most recent data and primary sources, there is compelling evidence that a **strong need** for **TSH** and the services it provides remain. There are still many more un-served eligible migrant youth and adults to be served in the tri-state area who, without **TSH**, are invisible to high school completion programs. The site locations include: Dodge City, Garden City, Fort Scott, and Liberal, KS; Guymon, OK; and Russellville and Northwestern, AR. Also, **TSH** is adding an on-line instruction approach to supplement in class instruction to address a multitude of situations.

The **goal** of **TSH** is: to provide high quality instruction and support services to 90 eligible migrant youth and adults annually to prepare them to complete the requirements for HSE and continue into post-secondary education, upgraded employment, or the military. **Three objectives** and the resulting **outcomes** are designed to accomplish this goal. The **objectives** include: 1) Seventy-five (75) percent of **TSH** students will graduate with an HSE (per Government Performance and Results Act - GPRA 1 formula), 2) Eighty-five (85) percent of **TSH** students will access support services, and 3) Eighty (80) percent of graduates will enter post-secondary education, upgraded employment, or the military. The GPRA targets are included in the objectives. Activities are designed to achieve objectives. **TSH has addressed Competitive Priority 1: Fostering Flexible and Affordable Paths to Obtaining Knowledge and Skills and Competitive Priority 2**, successful prior experience in accordance with 34 CFR 206.31.
