## PROGRAM PURPOSE

The CAMP is designed to assist migratory or seasonal farmworkers (or immediate family members of such workers) who are enrolled or are admitted for enrollment on a full-time basis at an institution of higher education (IHE) to complete their first academic year.

## ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

An IHE (as defined in section 101 and 102 of the HEA) or a private nonprofit (as those terms are defined in [34 CFR 77.1](#)) organization may apply for a grant to operate a CAMP project. If a private nonprofit organization other than an IHE applies for a CAMP grant, that organization must plan the project in cooperation with an IHE and must propose to operate the project with the facilities of that IHE.

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

**Priorities:** This competition includes one competitive preference priority and two invitational priorities.  
**Competitive Preference Priority:** For fiscal year (FY) 2025 and any subsequent year in which we make awards from the list of unfunded applications from this competition, this priority is a competitive preference priority. Under [34 CFR 75.105\(c\)\(2\)\(i\)](#), we award up to an additional 15 points to an application, depending on how well the application meets this competitive preference priority.  
**Invitational Priorities:** For FY 2025 and any subsequent year in which we make awards from the list of unfunded applications from this competition, these priorities are invitational priorities. Under [34 CFR 75.105\(c\)\(1\)](#), we do not give an application that meets these invitational priorities a competitive or absolute preference over other applications.
