



Name of Applicant: Crowder College, **City, and State of Applicant:** Neosho, Missouri

PROJECT GOAL 1:	
Recruit, enroll and support migrant students through the first-year college experience.	
Objective 1:	CC CAMP will identify, recruit, and select 40 qualifying participants.
Objective 2:	100% of participants will attend the first-year bridge event (Roughrider Orientation Clinic for Students, ROCS) and receive STEM and Computer Science Careers exposure.
Objective 3: (GPRA 1)	86% of CC CAMP participants will complete 24 credits in their first year.
PROJECT GOAL 2:	
Increase postsecondary enrollment of migrant students	
Objective 4: (GPRA 2).	92% of completers will enroll in postsecondary education in the subsequent year. (GPRA, 2).

Crowder College (CC) College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) plans to **serve 40** migrant and seasonal farmworkers (MSFW) in the Four-States and has developed goals and outcomes to identify and recruit participants. CC CAMP adequately assesses participant needs to ensure first-year college success and increased postsecondary education. CC CAMP establishes an environment for students to realize their “capacity to succeed,” which must be “built, reinforced, and maintained” during their critical first-year experience by developing a “sense of belonging,” as suggested study by Vincent Tinto (2017). To address the **Applicable Competitive Preference Priority 1:** CC CAMP will provide three STEM exploration and Computer Science events, with an intensive bridge 5-day orientation. The strong rationale developed by CC CAMP anticipates an “increased graduation rate” for participants, as discovered in the comparative study by Murphy et al. Participants attend the STEM Bridge event with hands-on experience with degree programs in STEM, Computer Science, and Non-STEM education. **Number of locations:** Six Crowder College campuses (MO). CC CAMP offers 30 residential and 10 Commuter Scholarships. **Project GPRA Targets:** 86% for GPRA 1 and 92% GPRA 2.
