Greetings, grantees -

We are writing to remind you that **all ARP ESSER and ARP EANS funds, including reverted ARP EANS funds, must be obligated by 9/30/24**. While the Department has communicated Tydings waiver information for the consolidation of certain State-level administrative funds, grantee and subrecipient ARP ESSER and ARP EANS program funds may not be obligated after September 30, 2024. Please see the linked 6/12/24 [ARP Obligations and Extensions](#) communication for additional information about obligating funds, repurposing or reverting funds, amending a State plan, and requesting a liquidation extension.

Additionally, States are reminded that they may not make new subawards or change any subaward amounts under any of the CARES, CRRSA, or ARP Act programs (except to correct allocation errors) after the obligation deadline has passed. However, if the SEA, in working with LEAs, determines that one or more LEAs do not need or do not intend to use all of their remaining ARP ESSER funds, the SEA may reallocate the unobligated ARP ESSER funds to the other LEAs (including charter school LEAs) in the State by **9/30/24**, in proportion to the amount of funds LEAs/charter school LEAs received under part A of Title I of the ESEA of 1965 in fiscal year 2020.
