

ABSTRACT

Name of Applicant: Oregon State University **City and State of Applicant:** Corvallis, OR

Project Objectives and Activities: The goals of OSU CAMP Community College Alliance program are to help students from migratory and seasonal farm worker (MSFW) backgrounds to 1) enroll and complete their first year in college and, 2) continue their post-secondary degree.

OSU CAMP Community College Alliance program will outreach and recruit students via school visits, Migrant Education Program (MEP) referrals, attendance at community events, and from networking with community organizations. Recruited students enrolled at the CAMP

Community College Alliance program will receive supportive and instructional services that will include academic advising, tutoring, a summer orientation program, a college orientation class, and peer mentoring. Other services will include support during the application process, assistance in obtaining financial aid, and follow up services for second year students.

Proposed Project Outcomes: 1) The project will serve 35 commuter students; 2) 100% of enrolled students in CAMP Community College Alliance will attend required academic and support services throughout the academic year; 3) 100% of second year continuing students will be transitioned and encouraged to participate in the academic and support services available at OSU and respective community colleges. **Number of Participants:** The project will serve 35

commuter students. **Location of the Proposed Site:** Oregon State University, Corvallis, Columbia Gorge CC - The Dalles, Blue Mountain CC – Pendleton, and Linn Benton CC -

Albany. **GPRA Performance Measures:** 1) **86%** (GPRA I) of students will complete their first year in college. 2) **92%** (GPRA II) of students who complete their first year in college will continue their postsecondary education. **Applicable Priorities:** Invitational Priority.
