

ABSTRACT

Portland Community College (PCC) is the largest institution of higher education in Oregon. In 2018-19, PCC enrolled nearly 60,000 full- and part-time students at four comprehensive campuses (Sylvania, Rock Creek, Southeast, and Cascade) and provided additional academic offerings at eight smaller centers around the Portland metropolitan area. Located in Portland, Oregon, PCC proposes a College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) based at the **Rock Creek Campus** in Washington County. PCC CAMP will annually *serve 45 commuter* migrant and seasonal farmworkers (MSFWs) and their immediate family members in five Oregon counties. In accordance with the Government Performance Results Act (GPRA), two GPRA objectives are specific and clearly defined to ensure measurement of program outcomes. **Objective 1:** 86% of students will complete the first academic year of college (GPRA 1). **Objective: 2:** 92% of students who complete their first academic year of college will continue their postsecondary education (GPRA 2). To accompany these objectives, PCC will provide a comprehensive **array of services and activities** that address the economic, and education challenges faced by MSFWs. Services include financial support, tutoring, academic advising, college and career readiness courses, leadership development, STEM activities, cultural activities, college visits, parental involvement, and follow-up services. **Applicable Priorities:** PCC CAMP addresses *Competitive Preference Priority 1* to promote science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education with a focus on Computer Science; and *Competitive Preference Priority 2* for prior experience.
