

## **State University of New York at Oneonta CAMP (CAMP Oneonta)**

### **ABSTRACT**

**Overview:** CAMP Oneonta will continue to provide migrant and seasonal farm working students of New York State with comprehensive academic and social support services in a rigorous college setting to encourage successful completion of their first year of college, and intensive follow-up support so they complete their postsecondary education.

**Objectives, activities and proposed outcomes:** (1) Increase college awareness by providing outreach and recruitment to 250 potentially eligible individuals to enroll 25 CAMP students each year; (2) Increase students' ability to receive appropriate financial aid for entry and completion of their first year and to continue in college; (3) Establish academic and social foundations for college success by providing quality 1<sup>st</sup> year CAMP programming, including a summer bridge program, freshmen orientation, Introduction to Higher Education seminar, academic skill building, STEM programming, emotional and transitional support, health services, housing accommodations, and extracurricular/cultural events; and (4) Increase the likelihood of degree completion by providing CAMP students with meaningful and effective follow-up services that result in the same or higher rates of completion than comparable at-risk and regularly admitted students. Project targets are set to result in at least 86% of CAMP participants completing their first year (GPRA measure 1) and at least 92% of those students continuing to be enrolled in post-secondary education after completion of the first year (GPRA measure 2).

**Number of participants and location:** The project will serve 25 residential CAMP students annually on the SUNY Oneonta Campus.

**Competitive preference priorities:** CAMP Oneonta meets two competitive preference priorities: 1) Promoting STEM education, and 2) Consideration of prior experience.
