

Part 3 UNM CAMP Project Abstract: The University of New Mexico (UNM), a public, four-year degree-granting institution in Albuquerque, New Mexico (NM), is currently one of very few Universities in the country to hold the designation of Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) & Research University-Very High Research Activity. As New Mexico's flagship university, UNM serves as the primary source of postsecondary educational and research opportunities across the state. Since 2001 UNM has provided support to UNM CAMP in serving migrant and seasonal farm working (MSFW) students and because of the established partnerships and prior experience the university continues to be in the best position to serve MSFW students in New Mexico. UNM will recruit **30** CAMP eligible high school students annually in collaboration with NM high schools, NM Migrant Education Program, and community agencies throughout the state. CAMP scholars will receive the necessary support, understanding, and resources to complete their first year successfully. CAMP will foster a space that will help them develop academic skills, be exposed to STEM career possibilities (**Priority 1**), provide a scholarship and financial literacy education necessary to begin their baccalaureate journey. The financial package provided will assist with the cost of attendance, which is one of several key factors in deciding to attend UNM. CAMP will undertake activities to strengthen scholars' understanding of the university by starting early in the admissions process, building relationships with parents, and providing both with a comprehensive orientation to be aware of university resources and opportunities. Enrolled CAMP students will learn the academic/university system through the CAMP freshman course, academic workshops, individual sessions with CAMP peer mentors, and regularly scheduled meetings with their advisor. CAMP peer mentors will provide peer-to-peer support and serve as role models for CAMP scholars Also, scholars will take part in educational and exploratory events to acculturate to the university and through inter-agency coordination and collaboration, CAMP will provide referrals to vital resources for scholars' future years. Through these intentional activities UNM CAMP expects 86% of the students to complete their first year (**GPRA 1**) and 92% to continue to be enrolled in postsecondary education (**GPRA 2**).
