

## PROJECT ABSTRACT

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**Name, City, and State of Applicant:** University of North Georgia (UNG), Dahlonega, Georgia.

**Project Objectives and Activities:** **1)** 35 eligible students will be served UNG CAMP each year through extensive outreach, recruitment, and advocacy; **2)** 86% of UNG CAMP students will complete their first year of college by providing comprehensive orientation, advising, coaching, peer mentoring, workshops, and cultural activities; **3)** 92% of UNG CAMP students who complete their first year of college will continue their college education through assistance with financial aid and scholarships, advising, workshops, and other services; **4)** 100% of UNG CAMP students will be provided training and opportunities to obtain an internship, apprenticeship or other work-based learning experience in STEM fields, including computer science through partnerships with agencies to provide career-based workshops and aides, and personalized assistance; **5)** 75% of UNG CAMP students who complete their first year will have a cumulative GPA of 2.25 or above by providing coaching, tutoring, workshops, supplemental instruction, and a first-year success course. **Applicable Priorities:** **1)** Promoting Science, Technology, Engineering, or Math (STEM) Education, With a Particular Focus on Computer Science; **2)** Consideration of Prior Experience. **Proposed Project Outcomes:** **1)** Raised awareness for migrant and seasonal farmworker families of college opportunities; and **2)** CAMP student success in their first year of college and persistence to their second year. **Number of Participants Served Annually:** 35 students (21 commuter and 14 residential). **Number and Location of Sites:** One site at the UNG Gainesville Campus, Oakwood, GA. **Project Targets for GPRA Measures:** GRPA Measure 1 - 86% of CAMP participants will complete the first academic year of their postsecondary program; GRPA Measure 2 - 92% of CAMP participants who complete their first academic year of college will continue their postsecondary education.
