



ABSTRACT

Name and Location: Washington State University's (WSU) located in Pullman; Washington has designed a comprehensive residential College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP).

Number to be served: Fifty (50) eligible students. **Project Objectives/Activities:** Grounded in evidence-based research, WSU-CAMP will combine institutional and program resources to meet all five stated objectives. Key components include recruitment and outreach, instruction, financial/economic literacy, academic support, career development, tutoring, and enrichment opportunities. A comprehensive evaluation plan along with a dedicated and experienced staff, aware of the unique needs of MSFWs, with strong connections will improve stated outcomes.

OBJ 1: To provide outreach recruitment services to 1,000 prospective participants and recruit (50) eligible MSFW students who are most in need of CAMP services. **OBJ 2:** To provide (50) MSFW students with needed academic support to successfully complete their first year at WSU.

OBJ 3: To provide (50) CAMP students with personal and career counseling, and academic advising/coaching services in order to help them successfully complete their first year at WSU.

OBJ 4: To provide (50) CAMP students with financial aid assistance and access to other federal, state, private, and institutional resources to support their first year in college. **OBJ 5:** To provide follow-up services to (50) students to enhance retention and graduation rates after successfully completing their first year at WSU. **Proposed Outcomes:** WSU-CAMP intends to meet GPRA

indicators of at least GPRA 1 - **86%** first year completion and GPRA 2 - **92%** second year

retention. **Invitational Priorities:** Activities and services provide by WSU-CAMP will meet student's social, emotional, and academic needs by providing specific and targeted student-centered programming designed to create a supportive, positive, identity-safe and inclusive climate for students with the help of fostering partnerships in government, education and community agencies focused on increasing equity and access for MSFW students.
