

**Part 3 Abstract: Name of Applicant:** Yakima Valley College (YVC) **City/State:** Yakima, Washington. **Project objectives and activities:** YVC, a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI) as well as a comprehensive public two-year college offering Applied Bachelor degrees, is proposing to provide CAMP services throughout the south-central Washington region to first-year, incoming migrant and seasonal farmworker (MSFW) students. The primary goal of the YVC CAMP program is to provide access to eligible MSFW students in the south-central Washington region and address the needs of eligible MSFW students enrolled or admitted to YVC on a full-time basis and ensure they successfully complete their first academic year. YVC CAMP **measurable annual objectives and outcomes** in support of this goal include: **1.** Conduct outreach to 500 MSFW students throughout the south-central Washington region per grant year; **2.** Provide and enroll 40 eligible CAMP students access and admissions to YVC; **3.** Provide 100% of eligible enrolled CAMP students access to internal and external financial, academic, career, and personal support services the first year of study; **4.** Cultivate and foster inclusivity of 100% of enrolled CAMP students into all facets of their college experience. YVC also addresses **Competitive Preference Priority 1:** promoting STEM education through access to internship or community service learning opportunities with internal and external constituents. YVC is a novice applicant and has never received a grant or subgrant under CAMP and does not apply to **Competitive Preference Priority 2:** Prior experience. **YVC CAMP will provide direct comprehensive services to 40 eligible MSFW commuter students attending YVC.** YVC CAMP will ensure 86% of CAMP students (34) will successfully complete the first academic year (**GPRA 1**), and 92% of CAMP students (37) will continue their post-secondary education (**GPRA 2**).
