Project Title: EE - TQP

Project Description: The EE-TQP project brings a team of committed partners together to create a dynamic collaborative system in which university faculty provide subject-matter and pedagogical expertise, teacher and leader mentors to support and guide resident teachers and administrative interns, program staff conduct professional development, and ensure that activities reflect the diversity of the communities participating in the project. Target Number of Project Participants to be Served: 40 future teachers in special education, and secondary mathematics and science; and 20 future school leaders.

Project Goals: Goal 1: Establish, increase collaboration, and sustain a Partnership of professional educators from IHEs and LEAs to develop and implement teacher residency and administrative internship programs that impact high-need school districts in New Mexico. Goal 2: Provide a residency program in high-need LEAs for 40 future teachers in special education, secondary science, and mathematics. Goal 3: Retain and support participating teachers during a two-year induction program. Goal 4: Identify and recruit 20 potential school leaders to participate in an internship program to impact education in rural high-need LEA(s). Goal 5: Retain and support participant school leaders in rural, high-need LEAs during a two-year.

Project Expected Outcomes: (1) Improved teacher and leader preparation programs; (2) Improve district induction programs; (3) Increased teacher and leader effectiveness; (4) Improved student achievement in math and science education; (5) Students with receive improved instruction; and (6) Improved teacher and school leader retention rates.
